Dress very smartly and make an entrance by standing purposefully inside the door for a few extra seconds as you familiarize yourself with the room. Do not go straight to the bar, but introduce yourself to a small group of colleagues who seem to be engaged in an open conversation. After a short conversation, excuse yourself, get a beverage or snack (never both at the same time) and carry on to another group. Two tips: Always carry your glass in your left hand, keeping your right hand dry and free for shaking, and wear your name tag on your right shoulder.
